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WHAT IS THE COUNTY DOING FOR YOU?

- The Lenawee County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) has shifted to full activation status.
- What does this mean? Currently, there are representatives from Fire, EMS, and Law Enforcement as well as the Emergency Manager, County Administration, Health Department, local hospital, Department of Health and Human Services, Public Information, and Community Mental Health. EOC staff meet daily to ensure needed resources and plans are in place to protect the safety of the public and responders throughout the COVID-19 response.
- Typically, individuals involved in the EOC work together physically at an established location. Due to the nature of COVID-19 and social distancing orders, EOC staff are working together virtually.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

- The EOC serves as a coordination hub for an incident response. Staff gather critical information, track trends, request and coordinate delivery of supplies, and report statistics to local organizations.
- The EOC finds means to secure the needed resources (including PPE) for Lenawee County. If these resources can not be procured, the EOC can request needed resources from the State of Michigan.
- Informing the public is another function of the EOC. It is our mission to provide the residents of Lenawee County with accurate, coordinated, and timely information.

HOW DO I GET INFORMATION?
